## **ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION**

The Craftsman style house at 11 Curve Street is a front-gabled, one and one-half-story form of four by three bays. Windows are a combination of 2/2, 4/4 and 6/6 double-hung sash. The center entry is occupied by a modern replacement door. A shed or porch formerly covering the entry and east side of the facade was recently removed. Cinderblock chimneys rise from the roof peak and from the west side elevation. The house is currently undergoing rehabilitation and so lacks front stairs and sections of exterior cladding.

## **HISTORICAL NARRATIVE**

The house at 11 Curve Street was built around the turn of the 20th century. The yard abutted pasture in 1939. A small orchard was nearby to the south at that time. William Copeland and his wife occupied the house from the 1950s until 1998.
