## **HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE**

This house is probably the dwelling labeled L. E. Cozzens on the Sherborn maps of 1874 and 1889 - there may have been an earlier house on this site. Owned by a Mr. Nash around the turn of the century, it was a chauffeur's house from the 1920's to the 1940's on the Whitman place, It was moved a few hundred yards to its present location by William MacAlpine in 1948.
