ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

The Colonial Revival style house at 43 Mill Street is a two-story, 4 by 2 -bay form. The ridge-hipped roof has deep eaves and a low brick chimney at the north side. A hipped porch articulated with slim piers, trellis and balustrade covers the center entry. Windows are 6/6 double-hung sash with shutters and low hoods. The setting is wooded.

A post and rail fence and a modern garage and shed are located in the side and back yards.

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

The house at 43 Mill Street was built to house employees of the Stannox Farm at **11 Nason Hill Road****. Henry Neale and Francis T. Daniels were taxed jointly for ownership of the farm in 1895, five years prior to the approximate date of construction. The agricultural operation at Stannox Farm included horses, oxen, cows and swine. A large orchard, pasture and parcel of woodland were located adjacent to the house in 1939. Agricultural laborers were the primary residents until the house was sold to a separate owner.
